Centering Prayer - Practice of the Week | Please visit the website to find all our prayer toolbox talks. Charlie Wheeler recently shared with us the practice of Centering. This is a way of silent prayer using one word to return to an awareness of God's presence. The method is below.

- 1. Choose a sacred word as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.
- Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within.
- 3. When engaged with your thoughts*, return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.
- 4. At the end of the prayer period, remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.

*thoughts include body sensations, feelings, images and reflections.
